


<p style="text-align: center;">English</p> <p>To begin the term, pupils will be introduced to various non-fiction genres such as biographies and non-chronological reports. Pupils will be using their active reading strategies in order to enable sound comprehension of the text types but also will be analysing the structure and grammar of them. This, in turn, will allow them to write their own non-chronological reports and biographies using their knowledge of our topic and significant people linked with it.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Maths</p> <p>This term, the pupils will be recapping long multiplication (4 digits by 2 digit numbers) then moving onto short division using bus stop method (4 digits by 1 digit numbers). The rest of the term will be focusing on fractions. Pupils will start by using diagrams to find equivalent fractions, before moving on to recognise and convert between proper, improper and mixed number fractions and be able to simplify these.</p>	<p><u>Spring Term 2</u></p> <p><u>Class – 5</u></p> <p>Earth and Beyond</p> <p>Class Book:</p>  <p>Christopher Edge</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Topic</p> <p>Our topic this term is <i>Earth and Beyond</i>.</p> <p>During this topic, pupils will learn about the poles of the Earth: the Arctic and Antarctic regions. Pupils will gain insight into what it is like to live in these places for both humans and animals. Pupils will be able to explore how glaciers are formed and the effect of climate change on this environment.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Science</p> <p>As part of the “<i>beyond</i>”, pupils will learn about the planets in our Solar System. Pupils will also understand the phases of the Moon and how this, as well as how the Earth rotates, create day and night, months and seasons, as well as shadows.</p> <hr/> <p style="text-align: center;">French</p> <p>Pupils will be continuing to build upon their learning so far by learning to talk about pets, hobbies and the weather.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">Art and D&T</p> <p>To begin with, pupils will plan, create and evaluate their paintings inspired by Peter Thorpe, a well-known space artist. Before moving onto creating pictures of the moon using a mixture of chalk and paint to create a certain effect.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Music</p> <p>This term lessons link with the topic as pupils will get the opportunity to listen to Gustav Holst “The Planets” and discuss how the music has been inspired by each planet. Pupils will use these pieces of music to compose their own based on a planet of their choice.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Computing</p> <p>Pupils will be using scratch to create a spaced themed maze with various levels, items to be collected and sounds included. Pupils will be encouraged to be as creative as possible when creating their mazes and to debug their mazes when they find a problem.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">PSHE</p> <p>The pupils will be focusing on the topic of <i>Diversity</i>. This will explore people’s attitudes towards gender, jobs, age and disabilities. Later in the term, we will also be covering <i>Drugs Education</i>.
