


<p style="text-align: center;">Geography The UK</p> <p>This term we will be learning about the UK. During our topic, the children will understand which counties make up the UK, labelling these on a map.</p> <p>Through this topic the children will then learn more about each of the four sections of the UK, including the waters which they are surrounded by.</p> <p>This term in geography, we are also celebrating Fairtrade fortnight. We will research Fairtrade food and where it comes from.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Maths</p> <p>We will begin this term by developing written methods for multiplication and division. We learn methods which will help us when multiplying larger numbers. These stations will be vocabulary, wonder (questioning) and clarification. Each skill will help us to become superstar readers and will help us to develop our comprehension skills.</p> <p>Our writing will begin with fables. We will be reading a modern fable called The Fate of Fausto. The children will learn that fables teach us important lessons and then they will lead up to writing their own version.</p> <p>Later in the term the children will be writing explanation texts about the lifecycle of a flowering plant and how bees make honey.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Science</p> <p>Our science topic will be all about plants. We will learn to talk about the parts of a plant and the important job each part has. As well as this we will explore the role of the flower in the life cycle of a plant through pollination, seed formation and see dispersal. We will explore what a plant needs to grow well and investigate how water travels in a plant.</p> <p>We will also be growing a range of plants throughout the term in our class vegetable plot.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"></p>
<p style="text-align: center;">PE</p> <p>Through PE this term, we will be developing our social skills. We will be developing our cooperation with others, including leading groups through mini challenges.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"> </p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Computing</p> <p>We will be focusing on online safety and research. The children will build on their existing knowledge of online safety. They will also learn how to research a topic of interest safely, following copyright laws.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">PSHE</p> <p>PSHE will focus on exploring emotions. The children will learn to recognise a wide range of emotions in themselves and others, how their actions affect others and develop strategies to resolve disputes.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">RE</p> <p>RE will focus on the big questions 'Why do Christians call the day Jesus died 'Good Friday'? and 'Why is Easter so important for Christians?'</p> <p style="text-align: center;">French</p> <p>In French, the children will learn names for pets, including colours. Towards the end of the term, they will be creating and describing their own hybrid animals.</p>
